

1 Ohio River Scenic Byway Welcome Center

On the corner in downtown Equality. View their extensive collection of artifacts from the salt well industry while taking advantage of indoor restrooms and visitor's information.



2 Saline County Fish and Wildlife Area

Fish, kayak, camp, and picnic at the 105-acre Glen O. Jones Lake where relaxation is ultimate. See the bronze statue honoring Shawnee Chief Tecumseh, who tried to unite the surrounding tribes in the early 19th Century.

5 Saline Creek Pioneer Village

Listed on the National Register of Historic Places, this fascinating pioneer village includes the original Saline County Pauper Farm (now a three-story museum), an old jail, an 1859 one-room schoolhouse, the Cain Church, a 1800s Blockhouse, several 1800s log cabins, a barn, and a country store.



8 Tunnel Hill

The 543 foot long railroad tunnel built in the 1870s that is the namesake for the nearby community and the Tunnel Hill State Trail, a 45 mile rails-to-trails bike and hiking path.

9 Pounds Hollow Recreation Area

Relax in this 28-acre picturesque lake nestled in a deep, wooded valley. Enjoy camping, picnicking, fishing, kayaking and swimming at the sandy beach. The Beaver Trail connects with nearby Rim Rock National Recreation Trail.



10 Rim Rock National Recreation Trail

Hike through native hardwoods along the rim of a rock escarpment where you can explore a prehistoric Indian stone fort, Fat Man's Squeeze and the massive Ox-Lot Cave shelter bluff. The Beaver Trail leads to Pounds Hollow Lake.

12 High Knob

Enjoy a panoramic view of the great Shawnee National Forest perched on the third highest point in southern Illinois and a perfect view for sunsets. A hiking trail encircles the hill with many slot canyons in the bluff to explore. The camp at the base of the hill is a Mecca for horseback riders.

25 One Horse Gap Lake

Visualize an ancient tribe of Native Americans passing through the narrow crevice down from the top of a sheer bluff. During the annual 9-Day Trail Ride, modern horseback riders take the same trail. The nearby 26-acre lake offers fishing, boating, and camping.

26 War Bluff Valley Wildlife Sanctuary

The largest Illinois Audubon sanctuary, this nearly 500-acre sanctuary is home to a large variety of birds and mammals, as well as a great diversity of rare plants, including native orchids.



27 Golconda Marina

This 206 slip, full-service, marina is the gateway to the Smithland pool of the Ohio River and one of the finest fishing and boating areas of the United States.

4 Shawnee National Forest Headquarters

Main office for the national forest with visitor information, displays and souvenirs for sale.

42 Lake Glendale Stables

Saddle up and enjoy an unforgettable horseback ride no matter what your experience level. Ride on your own or join up with one of their knowledgeable wranglers.

24 American Fluorite Museum

Discover the Illinois State Mineral, Fluorspar. Learn of this soft gemstone's history, production, and uses. Hardin County was known as the largest fluorspar-producing area of the United States.

41 The Chocolate Factory

A southern Illinois original. See their offerings of hand-made chocolates and fudges being prepared on a kitchen tour. They also serve ice cream. Located across the entrance to Dixon Springs State Park.



3 Old Stone Face

A 1/2 mile moderately strenuous trail takes you to scenic vistas and one of the finest and natural stone face rock formations. Continue on the Crest Trail to the Tecumseh Statue at Glen O Jones Lake 3 miles away.

20 Lake Tecumseh

Visitors can enjoy kayaking, fishing, and camping at this remote shallow lake.

6 Sahara Woods State Fish and Wildlife Area

This former coal mining area is now a 2,300 acre state park managed for hunting and fishing. Plans are being developed for off-road vehicle recreation trails.

7 Stonefort Depot Museum

Built in 1890, this former railroad depot is a step back in time with old signs from railroad companies and former businesses, tools and machines from the heyday of railroads and telegraphs are on display.

40 Hidden Springs Ranger Station

Forest Service ranger station offers information, restrooms, displays, and souvenirs.

11 Camp Cadiz

This former coal mining area is now a 2,300 acre state park managed for hunting and fishing. Plans are being developed for off-road vehicle recreation trails.

33 Burden Falls

During wet weather, an intermittent stream spills over bluffs in a picturesque series of waterfalls with a total drop of about 100 feet.

15 Golden Circle Natural Arch

This unique rock arch forms a natural amphitheater that was the secret meeting place of a group of southern sympathizers, the Knights of the Golden Circle, during the Civil War.



37 Trigg Tower

The last remaining fire lookout tower in the Shawnee National Forest. This 40-foot tower offers panoramic views of the hills of Southern Illinois.

35 Millstone Bluff

A National Register of Historic Places site adjacent to an old millstone quarry. The hiking trail leads to an interpreted site of a Mississippian Indian Village containing the remains of homes, stone graves, and rock art.

36 Sand Cave

The largest sandstone cave in North America with immense shelter bluffs. This site was part of the Underground Railroad in the 1800s with support from the abandoned Miller's Grove settlement nearby.

32 Bell Smith Springs Recreational Center

A series of clear, rocky streams and scenic canyons bordered by high sandstone cliffs and an abundance of vegetation unique to Illinois. Includes a total of 8 miles of interconnected trails featuring the largest arch in southern Illinois and several swimming holes.

28 Dixon Springs State Park

This 786-acre state park is situated on a giant block of rock cliffs with multiple springs and wet-weather waterfalls. A modern swimming pool is on site, as well as hiking in "Ghost Dance Canyon," and picnicking. The popular Chocolate Factory is across the road from the entrance.



22 Etown River Restaurant

From a floating restaurant on the Elizabethtown riverfront, enjoy a southern Illinois specialty, fried catfish, supplied daily from the Ohio River.

23 Miner's Memorial Statue

Visit the bronze statue dedicated to the fluorspar mining heritage of Rosiclare and the mining tragedy that claimed the lives of seven men in 1971. The statue depicts a miner headed to work as his wife hands him his lunch pail.



19 Tower Rock

Hike to the top of this majestic bluff rising 160 feet above the Ohio River midway between the historic river towns of Elizabethtown and Cave-in-Rock. Camping and picnicking are available, as well as fishing in the river.

21 Illinois Iron Furnace

Step back to the 1800s when "pig-iron" was smelted at this, the first charcoal fired furnace in Illinois. Now on the National Register of Historical Places, unwind at this secluded stream valley where you can picnic and visit "the ole swimming hole."

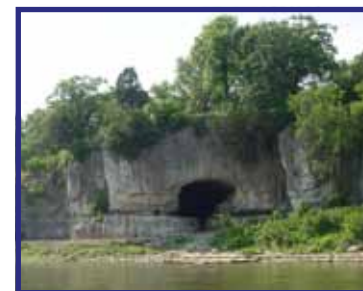


18 Cave-in-Rock Ferry

Ride the only Illinois Ferry crossing the Ohio River and visit our Kentucky Amish neighbors.

17 Cave-in-Rock State Park

Wander along the Ohio River and step into the large cavern, steeped in history of river pirates. Enjoy the spectacular river view from the lodge perched atop the overhanging bluffs. Cabins, restaurant, picnicking, showers and camping are available.



38 Rushing Road Scenic Lookout

An overlook offering scenic views across miles and miles of farmland and forests including Millstone Bluff off in the distance.

31 Indian Kitchen

Nearly 5,000 acres of the Lusk Creek Wilderness loaded with scenic canyons, streams, sandstone cliffs and trails for days including the Indian Kitchen Trail to one of the prehistoric stone fort sites.

14 "Sassy" Big Foot Statue

Stop and have your picture made with this popular Southern Illinois roadside attraction.



30 Lake Glendale Recreation Area

This 80-acre lake surrounded by tall pine trees and mixed hardwood forests offers hiking, camping (electric and primitive), boating, fishing and bicycling. A concession-run swimming beach is open seasonally.

13 Garden of the Gods Recreational Area

Explore the rock formations, cliffs, and trails of one of the most visited sites in Southern Illinois. See Camel Rock, Anvil Rock, Devil's Smokestack, Starry Night Rock, and other fascinating rock formations.

29 Hogg Hollow Winery

Of the many wineries in Southern Illinois, this is the only winery in southeastern Illinois. Several unique wines are available for tasting and works by local artists are on display.

16 Battery Rock

A prominent limestone bluff along the Ohio River, this National Register of Historic Places site was used by the Union Army during the Civil War. The bluff was used as a filming location for the film *How the West Was Won* in the 1960s.
